BE SUN SAFE

Just a reminder, all children must bring a broad-brim sun hat to school each day and wear clothing that covers their shoulders and tops of their arms. Items such as caps, singlet tops and dresses that don't give adequate sun protection should not be worn to pre-school. Please tick off on the daily sheet if you have applied sun screen to your child so educators don't need to reapply it in the morning.

HATS, SHOES & LABELLING

Just a reminder to all families that part of our service's policies is that all children must have a broadbrim hat each day they attend the service. If they arrive with a peak hat, we will provide your child with a loan broadbrim hat for the day. Remember that your child is always happier and more comfortable wearing their own hat and can learn to identify and be responsible for their own belongings.

Thongs, lose fitting sandals and crocs are not safe footwear for our outdoor environment. All these areas provide children the opportunity for climbing, balancing, and moving about on uneven surfaces. This becomes difficult and sometimes dangerous when children are not wearing the appropriate footwear. In addition children in the preschool environment will often go for walks around the neighbourhood and to the local park. They must have enclosed footwear to participate in these activities.

Labelling all hats, clothing, bags and drink bottles help educators to support children to learn to identify and become responsible for their own belongings. An identifying tag on your child's backpack will help to differentiate similar bags at the end of the day. Many children have the same or similar drink bottles and labeling minimizes children from drinking other children's water bottle.

COMMUNITY SHARE CUPBOARD

Currently located at the entry to the service we have a table and small fridge that is known as "The Cupboard of Shared Happiness" usually located on the preschool verandah. These cupboards are run in many communities and gives families the opportunity to give and receive.

We receive donations of near out of date items from Woolworths most days which is collected by the Bucketts Way Neighbourhood Centre and shared with us. Parents & other locals donate other food and items.

The clothes & shoes have also been donated so please help yourself or add items that are still in good condition that you no longer need from your home.

CASUAL DAYS

These can be booked through Kareen or Elizabeth. You can email or phone in your request and if a place is available, we will confirm the booking. Casual day booking forms are available from the office. For children booked in for the preschool program, casual days are only available as a long day care booking. If you think you may require casual days, please complete a Child Care Subsidy application before booking your day and/or alternatively speak to Robyn.

Please be aware that CCS subsidies have limits on the number of hours so extra days may be charged at the full rate.

MEDICAL PLANS

If you child is returning from 2022 and has a medical plan, please see Kareen to check that all the information is current. These documents will need to be signed as agreed for 2023.

If your medical management plan from your GP or specialist is more than 12 months old a new plan will need to be provided to the service.

ABOUT THE NATIONAL QUALITY FRAMEWORK

The National Quality Framework (NQF) provides a national approach to regulation, assessment and quality improvement for most education and care services for children around Australia.


The NQF aims to improve the educational and developmental outcomes for children attending education and care services and promote continuous improvement in service quality.

The framework includes:

- the National Law and National Regulations
- the National Quality Standard (NQS)
- a nationally consistent assessment and quality rating process
- approved learning frameworks.

A key element of the NQF is the National Quality Standard (NQS) which identifies seven quality areas that are important to outcomes for children. These quality areas are:

- Education program and practice
- Children's health and safety
- Physical environment
- Staffing arrangements
- Relationships with children
- Collaborative partnerships with families and communities
- Governance and leadership.

Families input to the service, NQS & QIP

As part of the NQS, our practice needs to be shaped by meaningful engagement with families and the community. The service's QIP (Quality Improvement Plan)

Another part of the NQS is that services develop a QIP. This document is focused on setting goals for further improvement of knowledge, skill & practice within the service.

Areas that we will be focusing on this year will include:

- How are our current sustainability practice embedded in our daily practice?
- Developing greater knowledge in supporting language development in children 0 to 5 years of age.
- Further developing our knowledge & skills in supporting risky play with children.
- Support further skills of our Room Leaders

Elizabeth Price – Director


